What is a School Council?

A School Council is a formal group of children within a school who are elected by their peers to represent them and their views. The council's aim is to enable the children to make a positive contribution to the way in which the school functions. The children's ideas and concerns are listened to and the meetings are recorded and shared with the rest of the school. It is an important and useful way that we can provide leadership and development opportunities for our children.

How are children elected?

At Rockmount, we teach the children about democracy within our PSHE curriculum. In order to emulate democratic processes, we will be carrying out the voting process in a fair and professional way so children understand how to vote and make sure the right person is elected. The children will be encouraged to think about what it would mean to be their class representative and if they would like the role, they will need to prepare a short speech for their class about why they should be voted for. We will then ask each class to decide who they would like to represent them by holding an election.

Next steps

If your child would like to represent their class and would be confident speaking in front of other children then please support them in preparation for the elections. The elections which will take place on **Friday 10th July** within your child's class. The successful candidates will be announced the following week.
