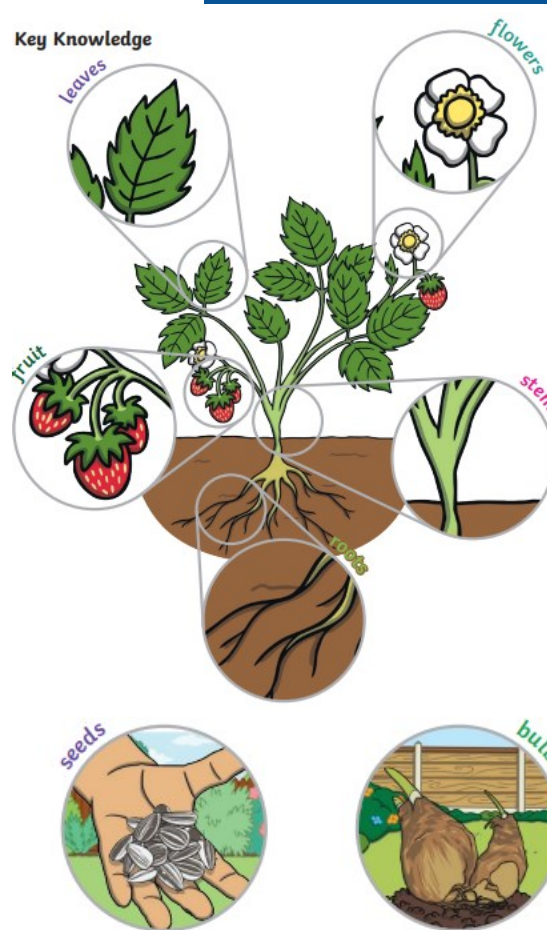


Key Vocabulary

<b>Wild plants</b>	A <b>wild plant seed</b> grows where it falls. It doesn't need to be planted or cared for.
<b>Garden plants</b>	<b>Garden plants</b> are plants that people choose to grow in their gardens.
<b>weed</b>	<b>Weeds</b> are <b>wild plants</b> that grow in places where people do not want them.
<b>deciduous</b>	A <b>deciduous</b> tree loses its leaves each year.
<b>evergreen</b>	An <b>evergreen</b> tree keeps its green leaves all year round, even in winter.
<b>roots</b>	<b>Opaque objects</b> can't be seen through
<b>stem</b>	A thing that can be used. For example a door, chair, car, table are all <b>objects</b>
<b>leaves</b>	Materials are what an object is made of.
<b>flowers</b>	Not easily broken or bent
<b>soft</b>	If something is soft, it is easy to cut, fold or change the shape of.
<b>fruit</b>	Can be pulled to make it longer or wider without breaking.
<b>seed</b>	Doesn't reflect light. Doesn't look bright
<b>bulb</b>	<b>Bulbs</b> grow into new plants
